

- If you want to be nominated for the Western Union Project Finish Line 2021, contact Dr. Loh-Hagan at vloh-hagan@sdsu.edu by October 12. Project Finish Line targets college level juniors and seniors experiencing financial hardship that may prevent the completion of their degree program. Selected scholars will receive up to \$10,000 for the 2021-22 academic year, based on the cost of tuition and fees and their demonstrated financial need. Students need to: (1) identify as Black, Indigenous, or Person of Color, (2) be in good standing, and (3) be current undergraduates pursuing a STEM or business degree. Selected students will need to submit a brief bio and a description of how the award will help them achieve their degree.
