APIDA Center celebrates Convoy Asian Cultural District!

San Diego's Convoy District is the commercial and cultural heart of San Diego's APIDA communities. It is one of the largest Pan-Asian business districts in the United States. In addition to Asian dining options, it offers Asian grocery stores, retail, professional services, entertainment venues, and community organizations. Centrally located in Kearney Mesa, it is in an area east of the 805 highway, west of Route 163, and south of Route 52.

As Asian immigrants settled in San Diego during the 1980s and 1990s, a handful of small Asian-owned family businesses popped up in the area. Soon, this area grew to house multi-generational entrepreneurs. In 2014, the Convoy District Partnership was founded and helped transform the area into a thriving community. In 2020, the city of San Diego, led by APIDA city leaders Chris Cate and Todd Gloria, officially recognized it as the "Convoy Pan-Asian Cultural and Business Innovation District." On August 8, 2022, signs of the "Convoy Asian Cultural District" were installed by the Clairemont Mesa Boulevard and Balboa Avenue exits. These signs are historic and important - they recognize San Diego's vibrant APIDA community and they help promote the 1500+ APIDA businesses in the district.

It's important to acknowledge that the land was part of the Kumeyaay Nation, colonized first by Spain, then by Mexico, and finally by the United States. In 1917, the U.S. Army established Camp Kearny (aka "San Diego's great war city"), an industrial-zoned area used to train marines in artillery and sailors in flying; in addition, the area was among the largest defense housing project in the country.

Then, the area changed. First, the APIDA population increased due to the repeal of the Chinese Exclusion Act in 1943 which allowed more Asians to immigrate and due to the influx of southeast Asian refugees as a result of the Fall of Saigon in 1975.

Prior to the 1940s, racist laws had forced Asian immigrants to live in the city's Chinatown area, which is today's downtown Gaslamp area. As laws changed and as the APIDA population grew, APIDA churches were established in the Kearney Mesa area Churches served as centers of community and safety, especially for APIDA newcomers facing cultural and language barriers. In addition to community, Asian immigrants were drawn to the cheap rents and cheap real estate in the middle of the city. This brought more APIDA residents and businesspeople to the area. In addition, the lower menu prices made Convoy a popular night spot for college students. Today, it continues to be a hot spot for good eats and fun.


