#### APIDA Center learns about Guam "Liberation" Day!

Located in the Pacific Ocean, the island of Guam is desired as a strategic military base. The indigenous people of Guam, known as <a href="Chamoru">Chamoru</a>), have faced centuries of colonization. From 1521-1898, Spain held colonial rule over Guam and suppressed Chamorro traditional practices, perpetuated Spanish values, and spread Catholicism. The Spanish-American War (1898) led to the Treaty of Paris (1898) which forced Spain to cede Guam to the United States, which held colonial control until WWII (1939-1945). (Note that territories are not a state or a country, having no rights, responsibilities, or powers which limits their ability to autonomously govern. Activists continue to advocate for sovereignty and for the preservation of indigenous life.)

From 1941-1944, the Japanese imperialist army held colonial rule over Guam; these years consisted of worker exploitation, torture, and executions. On July 21, 1944 the Japanese surrendered to the United States who took back colonial control of Guam. This date is known as "Guam Liberation Day" and is now an annual celebration held in Guam. It's Guam's largest celebration and consists of a queen contest, carnival, fireworks, parades, memorials, and more.

On July 21st, the people of Guam commemorate the end of Japanese rule by U.S. military forces. They also memorialize the thousands of Chamorros who died during Japanese occupation, especially those who were incarcerated at the Manenggon concentration camp.

Although July 21st celebrates their "liberation" from Japanese colonial rule, Guam has not received true autonomy or "liberation" as U.S. colonization has not only limited rights but has also contributed to the erosion of indigenous culture and to environmental destruction - such as fueling Super Typhoon Mawar.\* Occupation has contributed to climate change in the Pacific Islands which has led to more powerful hurricanes and typhoons.

\*The APIDA Center would like to acknowledge the residents of Guam who have been impacted by <u>Super Typhoon Mawar</u>, which hit Guam starting on May 19th. During this time of widespread environmental destruction, loss, and uncertainty, we recognize the importance of collective response in rebuilding community and the power in understanding the roots of climate disasters.
