APIDA Center remembers Chinese laborers who built the Hotel Del Coronado!

On Monday, September 4, SDSU's campus will be closed in observance of Labor Day. This holiday uplifts labor activists who advocated for the 40-hour work week, safer working conditions, paid time off, and sick leave. However, these labor protections were not uniformly established across worker groups and racial identities. In San Diego, Chinese immigrant workers faced social, political, and economic challenges.

In the 1850s, Chinese immigrants left their homeland in pursuit of economic opportunity in the United States. Many Chinese immigrants were employed in manual labor jobs (i.e., farming, laundering, railroad construction, etc.) However, their employment was viewed as a "threat" to White workers, who accused Chinese immigrants of taking away their jobs. Chinese laborers faced discriminatory policies and endured unsafe working conditions with little pay.


A cheap labor force, they were hired to build the Transcontinental Railway and the Southern California Railroad which spanned San Diego, Oceanside, and Barstow. They received a wage of \$2 per day and were classified as "unskilled" workers. From 1880-1885, Chinese immigrant laborers were transported from San Francisco and Oakland to San Diego. In San Diego, they built railroads as a non-union workforce and were tasked to construct the famous Hotel del Coronado which began in 1887.

Barracks were constructed near the hotel to house the workers in close proximity to the building site. This iconic hotel has served as a backdrop in Hollywood movies and continues to attract visitors from all over the world. However, there is very little mention of the Chinese labor that largely built this iconic establishment.
