APIDA Center learns about Justice for Fil-Am Veterans!

In honor of Veteran's Day (November 11) next week, we remember the Filipino/Fil-Am veterans who served in the U.S. military during WWII (1939-1945).

From 1898-1946, the Philippines was a U.S. colony. When WWII broke, approximately 260,000 Filipinos and Filipino Americans answered the call to defend the United States. They contributed greatly to the U.S. victory in the Pacific.

The Rescission Act of 1946 retracted the benefits, compensation, and honor promised to Filipino/Fil-Am veterans who served during WWII. Out of the 66 countries allied with the United States, the Filipino/Fil-Am troops were the only group denied compensation and recognition.

As a result, grassroots organizations have advocated for the reinstatement of their promised benefits. Since the 1990s, for over 25 years, the Justice for Filipino American Veterans (JFAV) has advocated for compensation and recognition. For over 15 years, organizers held an annual march in Los Angeles which included Filipinos Americans from across Southern California (and San Diego) into action.

In 2015, student groups from UC Los Angeles such as Samamhang Pilipino, Theta Delta Beta, Zeta Phi Rho, and Tinig Choral group united to help plan the march. This event consisted of 600-800 Filipino elders and youth; it was both a display of advocacy and a form of historical preservation of the Filipino/Fil-Am veterans' experiences.

As a result this organizing, the Filipino Veterans of World War II Congressional Gold Medal Act was signed into law in 2016. In 2017, 600 Filipino/Fil-Am veterans and their families received their medals. The last documented JFAV March was the 18th Annual March which took place in 2018 where community members gathered at MacArthur Park in Los Angeles. Today, there are still over 10,000 veterans who have yet to be formally recognized. To this day, advocates are still fighting for Congress to repeal the Rescission Act of 1946.

She taught us that anybody can weave and that anything can be woven! She said that weaving is in our DNA. We will continue to weave in November!
