APIDA Center learns about Holi in San Diego!

Hinduism is not only observed in India; it is also practiced in Nepal, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and Bhutan. Holi is a Hindu festival that marks the beginning of the Spring season. This year, it is celebrated on March 25, 2024.

During this time of unity, people will gather to celebrate with music, dance, and color. Each color signifies a positive quality that Hindus want to accentuate in their lives. This holiday celebrates new beginnings. Hindus light bonfires that represent the burning of evil and the welcoming of good. Holi is popularly celebrated across South Asia; in addition, Hindus in the diaspora have established their own local traditions.

South Asians in San Diego mainly reside in Mira Mesa or Miramar. Approximately 1% (30,000+ people) in San Diego identify as Hindu. Many frequent the Shri Mandir temple. This temple is located in an ethnic enclave in Mira Mesa known as "Little India."

In close proximity is the well-known Miramar Cash n Carry, an Indian grocery story that serves as a source of community. It is also a sponsor of the Child Rights and You (CRY) San Diego Holi 2024. This celebration will take place on March 23rd from 11-3pm at the Hourglass Field, Miramar College. CRY Holi has existed in San Diego since 2012. CRY raises funds for children's' rights in both the United States and India.

In North County San Diego, more Holi festivals will be celebrated this upcoming weekend. Poway and Escondido are also home to a flourishing Hindu community. The Gujarati Association of San Diego is hosting a Holi Festival on March 23rd starting at 10am at Kit Carson Park in Escondido. Both celebrations welcome families to engage in traditional dances and meals.

At these events, children can access Pichkari, or water guns to spread the colors of abundance, protection, and good fortune to all attendees.

Also, don't forget to join APIDA Center's Holi Festival events including a special Holi dinner at The Garden.

APIDA Center hosts collaborative events!


